TIME TO GET READY

To add or update your new photo

Sign into "Members Only" on the DBC web page.

- At the Welcome Screen click the "Update your data button."
- In the upper left-hand corner of the page you'll see "Select your picture file." Click on the "Browse..." button.
- From there you are taken to a directory on your computer. Navigate to your photos and select any file ending in jpg or jpeg or gif.
- The maximum character string length for the picture location and name must not exceed 75 characters.
- Once the file is selected, click on the "Update" button and the picture will be displayed on your page and stored on the DBC server.

The process may seem complicated but it works. And best of all you can always select a different photo on your second try.


From the Purser...



Fishing Report...

Jeanine and I took the boat out from Homeport Marina and targeted sheepshead and silver trout. Jeanine caught an undersized mangrove snapper with hermit crabs, I caught one undersized sheepshead at a dock and then decided to find some silver trout for dinner. We drifted the channel on the north side of the last causeway bridge using lead head 3/8 oz jigs with a 3-inch rubber tail in gold and rootbeer colors. We found fish from 19-27 ft depths making sure our jigs were on or near the bottom. Giving the jigs a slight twitch gave us many strikes as we went thru the school of fish. When in the school you will receive multiple strikes until a fish is hooked. We only kept 10 fish which were easy to filet, our largest was 13 inches and they rarely exceed 15 inches. You can easily fish for silver trout from a kayak and they will remain in the channel usually till the end of April.

If you would like I can schedule a fishing event targeting silver trout, call me and let me know who would be interested.

Go out on the water, be safe and have fun!


Book Club...

Receiving a call for a roommate who signed up for a FREE sailboat ride, since she wasn't home, Jeanine asked if she could go in her place. That morning she jumped aboard a yngling from the Sailing Club at UWM. The rest is history. "From the moment I was on the water, a calmness took over me." Her love for sailing was born. Joining SCUWM, she went on to be Social Chair, board member and newsletter coordinator as well as getting her 'Skippers Rating'. SCUWM's dock was across from the Milwaukee Yacht Club.



Jeanine raced and crewed for several boat owners of the MYC and the South Shore Yacht Club. Twice she raced in the Queen's Cup. This race crosses Lake Michigan's 87 miles to South Haven Michigan.

Career wise, after college, she obtained an executive position with Federated Department Stores. Then onto opening up the 44th TJ Maxx store in the US. She joined the Single's Sailing Club until she was married in 2006 to Howard & his 3 teen aged boys. Life became very busy raising 3 boys, running her real estate business and 3 rental properties. 




