

Fishing Report...

The cold fronts have come and reduced the water temperature enough for both king fish and large Spanish mackerel to be just offshore. Chum and use live greenbacks to catch them! The stone crab traps are out and the buoy above them may hold a nice tripletail. Cast live shrimp or greenbacks to catch one and make sure they measure 18 inches before you keep one. They are fun to catch on light tackle.

Inshore trout, redfish, and snook will be on the flats along with some black drum and sheepshead. Offshore hit the hard bottom to find tasty white grunts, seabass, snapper, and possibly a keeper grouper. Watch the weather and get out on the calmer days, Magic Seaweed is a great app to check the sea conditions before you venture out. Be safe and go catch some fish!

Insights...



November Highlight Peggy Schott Member Since 2008 I grew in upstate New York with little contact with water and boating. I went to Syracuse University and there met my future husband, Chuck. After we married, I discovered that he was a SCUBA diver and wanted me to become a diver. As I loved him dearly, I took a certifying class and passed by the skin of my teeth. That was because I was terrified. But we went diving in the lakes and quarries of central New York.

In 1971, we moved back to my home town of Kingston, New York. We had 1 daughter and a second on the way. We started a dive club there and I persisted in diving. Chuck's dream was to have a Dive Shop. So, we opened one in the basement of our home. We stocked it sparsely at the beginning, but as we sold stock, we invested in more so within a year or two we had a fully stocked dive shop with a compressor and tanks to supply air. I loved this, because I really didn't enjoy diving, so I with my two young children watched the shop, while Chuck instructed and ran trips.

We eventually moved the shop into a real building and continued working it. Chuck was diagnosed with lymphoma and died about 2 years later. Our girls were 7 & 11 at that time. I was encouraged to keep the shop by our ScubaPro sales manager. Since we now had no instructors, within 3 weeks, a good friend and I went off to New Hampshire to become certified SCUBA instructors.

This is when everything changed. Now when I dove, I had students to watch over and I lost my fear of diving and began to love it.



Insights...

Chuck had bought a 23 foot boat and I used it to take students diving in lakes within a few hundred miles. I ran trips to New Port and Massachusetts and dove with my students in the ocean. And I began to run trips to the Caribbean.

Meanwhile, I met George. He had visited the shop when Chuck was alive. We both skied and met at a Halloween Party thrown by our ski club. Two years later we were married at the same ski club party. No one knew about it until it happened. I was in my mother's wedding dress and he rented tails and a top hat. Our kids, by now all in their teens, were dressed in costumes, also. Ask us to show you the album and we will.

In 1987 we sold our house and dive shop and moved to Dunedin. Since we've lived here, we have continued boating and diving and now kayaking.

Among the watery things we've done together was a sailing, diving, bare boat trip to Tonga. We have owned 4 power boats together and have had lots of sailing vacations, also. Now that George is no longer interested in maintaining a boat, we kayak.

We have also owned a 5th wheel and spent several years traveling the country between April and November each year.




