For those who also do the Gulf races, this is the perfect time to try out and train new crew members so you will be ready for the challenge of the Dunedin Cup.

The races are open to a Sunfish fleet and a fleet of keel boats with current PHRF ratings.

Next race is August 19th. Warning starts at 6:40pm. Sign up at Yacht Scoring. Brews and bites post race.



Fishing Report...

Pasco County scalloping was great this year! I was out six different days and all on board our boat returned with a limit of scallops each day. Last day of the Pasco season I had my limit by 10am.

Now we are catching blue crabs at night during a low tide walking the grass beds. A buddy who I introduced to crabbing this year caught 19 in an hour. All you need are water shoes, five gallon bucket, headlamp, and a crab net. This year has been a great one for blue crabs!


Redfish can be catch on the oyster bars and along the mangroves using cut bait such as pinfish, mullet, or ladyfish for bait. Put a large chunk on a 4/0 circle hook and get ready for the pull. One redfish 18-27 inches can be kept, however I would not keep one under 20 inches.

Again, be advised that new boating regulations took effect on July 1st stating all motorboats under 26 ft must have a kill/engine cut off switch with lanyard attached to the driver when the boat is under way. The purpose is to ensure that the boat engine will shut down if the driver is thrown from the boat.

Keep an eye out for thunderstorms and be safe out there!


Blood Drive...

August Highlight

Jim & Jeanne Davis
Lifetime Members
1986

Jim and Jeanne Davis are Lifetime members of the DBC, Circa 1986. We have been happily married for almost 26 years and have raised two beautiful daughters, Morgan and Anna, now 25 and 23 years of age. Jim was Commodore of DBC way back in 92'. Lots of water under the bow since then!


Jeanne was a graduate of DHS class of 79' and grew up boating with her mom and dad. She planted roots firmly in Dunedin, before Dunedin was cool... and retired after a 33 successful years in high-end marketing.

We have been a sailing family from the get go. I met Jeanne at the Bikini Cup "after race" party in 1995 and the rest is history. This was around the same time that the Clearwater to Key West Race was kicking off and I said my goodbyes to her and shoved off on a J 40 with skipper TJ Frayne of "Fraynes" Fashions, for those of us who've been around long enough to remember them. With a crew of 5, we ran the course in 27 hours and only 5 tacks, to take a 1st place trophy for our efforts. We grilled steaks for dinner the 1st night.

At home aboard our families 1st Morgan 34', a teal colored sloop named "Camelot", which we had already owned for some 20 years, a new business was taking off and more importantly, we were halfway through our 2nd pregnancy. We sold Camelot but hung the special Stainless Steel Danforth anchor that our good friend Ben Skinner had made for us in the garage, with a sign on it that read "Keep the Faith".

We bought and ran a Coachmen 35 C class RV, aptly named The "Land Sloop" and took our kids and family everywhere, sometimes pulling our Searay 18 behind. Many miles were covered and we enjoyed our retirement dreams a little early, with our kids with us. Almost 15 years of RV adventures. We had a blast.

Fast forward to 2016! With our good friends Bob and Katie Ackley, we had been talking for years about the time we might find, and buy another Morgan 34. Bob and I thought we should partner on it and we found Geronimo, in Atlantic Highlands New Jersey, a harbor just across New York City's downtown financial district. Jeanne had made me promise I wouldn't find a "fixer upper" and that is just what we did.



Insights...



Geronimo is a classic 1966 vintage. They just don't make em' like that anymore. She'll sail her handicap and then some, although we haven't found all that much time for racing her. With a 3' 3" draft and an 800 lb. bronze centerboard, she'll go to weather like a champ and will "run" in excess of her hull speed.

I first fell in love with the Morgan 34 when as a 21 year old, I had stopped at the city marina one night after work (I was the store manager at Lueken's Food Villa at 975 Broadway Ave., where the Holiday Inn Express is now) around 9:30 pm to soak up the night air and enjoy the strong breeze. Out of the dark, a light blue hulled M34 sailed into the marina with a hanked on jib flying. He sailed solo, up to the wall where I was standing, tacked with only a few feet to spare and sailed off into the night again. It was Ben Skinner, on Mexicana. I knew I had to have one of those boats someday! We became fast friends and sailed and raced together for oh so many years. We would raft up at Three Rooker with all the other Morgans we knew and enjoyed the Morgan camaraderie. What do they call it when two or more Morgans raft up? A Morgasm.

Ben was known to hail us on the VHF... Camelot, Camelot, where for art thou Camelot? A favorite song onboard stated - "don't let it be forgot, that once there was a spot, for happily ever aftering, that was know as, CAMELOT". Words and music we still live by today.

I've had boats, starting with a Kool ™ Cigarette sailboat that mom bought me at age 13 to Hobies, to a Hermann 19' Bay Sailor, and two M34's. Our current M34 Geronimo, is named honoring our brother Keith. We are blessed to live in this area we call home, Dunedin. We are thankful for our friends and family, and for the many friends we have made through all the years as DBC Boat Club Members. Jeanne and I encourage all the members, active, and wanna' be active, to jump in, with both feet. The camaraderie I speak to above exists here as well. Volunteer often and be a part of the joy of boating that we all share. Jeanne and I are trying to slow down some (haha) and look forward to those days ahead, and the chance to meet and get to know more of our DBC fellow members.




