Hello Members. It's hard to believe the year is almost over. A few things for November.

WAIVER: Skippers are required to read and agree to a waiver during registration. Acceptance of the waiver is a requirement to participate in the Lighted Boat Parade.

NO POLITICAL DECORATIONS: We ask that boat decorations DO NOT contain politically related messages.

NO SANTA DECORATIONS: We ask that boat decorations DO NOT contain a likeness of Santa, as the real Santa will be arriving on the last boat

PARTICIPATION: This event is open to all boaters (Members and Non-Members). Registration is required to participate.

REGISTRATION: REGISTRATION STARTS: November 1, 2022 through December 1, 2022.

TO REGISTER: Click on the blue "Register" button on this is no fee to register and participate. However, there is a limpage. **NOTE**: The "Register" button will no longer appear once registration is closed.

FEES: There is no fee to register and participate. However, there is a limited number of registrations available. If you register, please plan to participate.

Fishing Report...

The cold fronts are here and the water temps are dropping causing many species of fish to migrate through our area! Kingfish and Spanish mackerel can be found 1-2 miles offshore using live greenbacks for bait. Slow troll a Spanish mackerel, ladyfish, or blue runner on a stinger rig to hook into a good sized kingfish. Remember to loosen up your drag and let the larger fish run to prevent a breakoff.

Sheepshead are available on dock pilings and around bridges. Best baits are fiddler crabs, mud crabs, mangrove crabs, and small shrimp on a #1 or 2 hook with just enough weight to get it down. These are hard fighting fish and great on the table.

Triple tail can be found near crab trap buoys and channel markers, cast a live shrimp, greenback or small jig to hookup with these strange looking but tasty fish.

Watch the weather and pick your days, the fish are out there and hungry!

Feel free to contact me if you want to fish or need info on how to catch them. Remember, we have a forum on our website.

Get out there and fish!



Soon after we joined the Boat Club. You know that old saying "It takes a village"?


I believe the Boat Club was part of that village for Phillip. I'd like to share some of my favorite stories and some of Phil's life lessons at the Boat Club.

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



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
