IT IS RENEWAL TIME FOR YOUR 2023 - DUNEDIN BOAT CLUB MEMBERSHIP

The annual membership dues for this year are:

Most of you have already completed your membership renewal. This is your last reminder. You have received a 2023 renewal invoice via email. There is a link where you can pay your renewal on our website. The preferred method of payment is to pay your 2023 annual membership dues online via our website. KEY EXCHANGE: The key exchange for 2023 will begin prior to the February 20, 2023 General Meeting. Bring your old key and get your 2023 key. Lost keys can be purchased for \$ 5.00. The new key will operate ONLY the east (marina side) door. When you lock the building, lock the west door from the INSIDE and lock the east door with the KEY.

VERIFY YOUR ONLINE DIRECTORY INFORMATION: Please verify your name, address, phone number, email address, and boat information is correct on the website (dunedinboatclub.org). Should you have any questions regarding the verification process, please contact Bill Goocher.

MEMBERSHIP CARDS: Once your renewal invoice is marked as paid, you can view and print your 2023 DBC Membership Card via our website. **NOTE:** Your membership card is also available for display via our mobile app.

RECOPRICITY CARDS: Once your renewal invoice is paid, you will be given a 2023 Reciprocal Courtesy Card from the Yachting Club of America. This reciprocity card gives you access to over 600 other yacht and boat clubs across the U.S. and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

LATE RENEWALS: Don't delay your renewal. Any renewal request received AFTER the Feb 20th General Meeting requires approved by the DBC Board for your membership to be reinstated and creates additional administrative and paperwork by our volunteers.

Race Committee

The Race Committee has been practicing running races, making process improvements and training in Basic Race Management. We were ready to go for our first race, but unfortunately it was cancelled due to weather last weekend.

February 25th - Pass-a-Grille Run, a Gulf Region Boat of the Year race hosted by Dunedin Boat Club and Clearwater Yacht Club with the reception at St. Petersburg Yacht Club. This is a PURSUIT race where the slowest rated boat starts first and the remaining start in accordance with their rating, the idea being that since the handicap is given at the start, the boats should end up finishing around the same time.

It is a great format for anyone newer to racing who is intimidated by competitive starts as each boat starts alone at their own time. The first boat over the finish line is the winner, followed by the rest in sequence. The race goes from Clearwater to the Pass-a-Grille MOA, finishing with rafting up at the Pass-a-Grille St. Pete Yacht Club

Fishing Report...

In between the cold fronts, inshore fishing has been good for both speckled and silver trout. Silver trout (sand trout) can be found on the north side of the last bridge before heading to Honeymoon State Park. Just drift the channel from the bridge to the dock located on Royal Stewart Arms Condos and watch your fish finder for clouds of fish near the bottom. Any soft tail jig will produce these silver trout which have soft mouths so loosen your drag to prevent losing fish.

We are finding the larger speckled trout on the north side of the spoil islands on the north side of the causeway. Also, the grassflats in 4-5 foot of water are producing some nice trout using DOA shrimp, Mirro Lures (mirrodine is great), and paddle tail jigs. Bycatches have been bluefish, Spanish mackerel, pompano, and ladyfish using artificials.

Make sure you fish before a front arrives to dirty the water or 2 days after when the winds are gone and the water temperature is rising. Limit is 3 speckled trout per person 15-19 inches, one is allowed per boat over 19 inches. Silver trout (sand trout) have no size limit and a bag limit of 100 pounds, but only keep what you need for a good meal.


Book Club...

This month's volunteer spotlight is on John and Lesley Roseman.



Joel who talks for Ireland, had an interesting time chatting with Mark and Arlene that ended with an invite for Joel and I to attend the Chilli Cook Off and Auction at Dunedin Boat Club.

Lesley and I are both Glasgow born, I was introduced to boating at a young age being sent to stay with relatives at the Coastal Village of Fairlie in Ayrshire most school holidays. 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
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
