

Fishing Report...

The weather is starting to cool down bringing numerous schools of baitfish close to shore. Spanish mackerel and bluefish can be seen tearing into the schools of bait from 150 yards to ½ mile off the beach. Anchor off the beach and use live greenbacks on a long shank 3/0 hook to catch these fish. Both are excellent to smoke and the mackerel can be fileted cutting out the blood line making it a great tasting fish.

I have been crabbing at night during the low tides and have caught nice sized blue crabs. You can find the crabs on any grass flats in our area at night using a bright headlamp of flashlight along with a dip net and 5 gallon bucket to place the crabs in as you wade in knee deep water.

Get out there and catch some fresh seafood!



Community Efforts...

Dunedin Boat Club member, **Eric Graves** volunteers for a local Dunedin charity called **JoyRides**.

JoyRides take seniors and mobility challenged people around Dunedin on rickshaws at no charge...maybe you have seen them in the red-canopied rickshaw bikes or the wheel chair enabled rickshaw bike.

The fleet is comprised of two rickshaws, each holding two passengers, one wheelchair rickshaw that carries a passenger in their own wheelchair, and an escort bicycle. Every ride is tailored to ensure the comfort of the passengers, and, if needed, their caregiver. Operating Monday through Friday, the fleet makes its way to assisted living facilities, memory care units, rehabilitation facilities, and local nursing homes. Joy Rides has partnered with organizations such as Mease Life and The Stirling House to provide weekly rides to their residents. Many riders enjoy the experience so much, they become regular riders.

Eric and other JoyRides pilots often take guests by the Dunedin Boat Club and share some of the history and the great scenery there.

JoyRides is a really special charity organization that Eric feels fortunate to be part of. They are working on getting the word out on JoyRides to build ridership and volunteers.

Insights...

Harold and Lucindy Schomaker

On a family vacation in Pensacola, FL, at the age of 13, Harold had his first sailing lesson on a Sunfish. That hooked him on sailing. At age 14, he and his father built a 14' Glen-L sailboat which he sailed on Lake Pontchartrain in New Orleans for many years. During his college years, he was on the USL sailing team and raced sailboats inter-collegiately. After college, he and a buddy re-built a 1949 Lightning Class sailboat, which he never got to sail.

For the next couple of decades, a variety of power boats and sailboats were in and out of his life, depending on the body of water in the area. While in Virginia Beach, VA, he had a Hobie Cat 16 which was kept on the Atlantic Ocean beach. Flying a hull on the Hobie Cat in the Ocean was an absolute blast. Then came the Cal 27 Fire 'n' Water (zodiac earth signs of the owners) which he used to cruise around the Cheasepeake Bay and Hampton Roads.

After settling down in Pinellas County, he started on his sailboat climb starting with a Pacific Dolphin 23 sailboat (Solace), met Lucindy, who encouraged him to purchase a larger boat, Cal 29 sailboat (Island Life). Once married, she encouraged him to get a bigger boat which lead to the purchase a Gulf Star 37 sailboat (Maxine).





Insights...

A sinking incident of the Gulf Star lead to yet a bigger boat, a Grand Banks 42 Classic trawler (At Last), which is their current boat docked in Dunedin Marina. This is the biggest vessel Harold has skipped and she is really testing his skills. Harold says no more bigger boats, in time will start the path to smaller boats. Lucindy calls the Grand Banks "our 2 bedroom, 2 bath condo on the water".

Lucindy became a water person during her childhood summers on Lake Superior and going out on her grandfather's fishing trawler. She learned how to swim in the Pacific Ocean. With her father being in the military, she has participated in water activities all over the United States. Her first sail was on the Cal 29 which she immediately enjoyed and has become a great first mate. She is still learning the ins and outs of boating and trying to learn how to steer in a straight line despite her double vision.



Insights...

Lucindy and Harold have done a few local cruises to get comfortable with the big boat. They plan to do cruising with the Club and with friends. Doing the Great Loop is not out of the question.

Lucindy still works, so Harold is down at the boat doing the maintenance during the week which never seems to stop. They try to spend weekends on the boat as often as possible and putting around in St Joseph Sound enjoying the sights, weather, and just being on the water. This past summer has been really hot which has slowed down their putting around.

When traveling on land, Lucindy and Harold seek out lighthouses and maritime museums to visit and learn about the maritime history of the area.

Harold joined the Dunedin Boat Club in 1998 and has held many positions on committees, board and bridge. He was Commodore in 2018. In 2013, the Cal 29 won DBC Boat of the Year for the Bay Series. This past Summer, Harold finally became a vampire at the annual pig roast. Yes, he stayed up all night — as he says "a remarkable feat for someone who has a hard time staying awake until 9ish PM". Lucindy only last until 1:00AM!
