

PLEASE NOTE: Dunedin Cares cannot accept any used or opened food items. All packages must be within expiration and factory-sealed. Please no clothing or household goods.




Fishing Report...

The water has cooled down and the bait fish have arrived in mass. Eric Graves and I spent a day about 2 miles off Clearwater Beach chasing the bait schools and casting gotcha lures, chrome jigs, and paddle tails. We ended up with 3 Spanish Mackerel in the boat and landed a dozen Bonita of which I kept 7 for my stone crab traps. We also landed several large ladyfish and had several cut offs from large mackerel.

Stone crab season opens on the 15th of this month and you are allowed to place your traps in the water 10 days in advance. I just finished the repairs to our traps and will place them in the water this weekend.

Inshore fishing has been good in the passes with pompano hitting banana jigs and trout and mackerel hitting paddle tails. Redfish are starting to school and can be found in the oyster beds. I received word today that the Belleair Causeway has schooling redfish that can be caught using both live and cut baits. Get out there and fish!














Book Club...


