Fishing Report...

The kingfish are in according to reports. Best bet is to drift with a blue runner or ladyfish attached to a stinger rig you can purchase at your local tackle shop. You can also troll for them using large spoons! Watch for birds working the baitfish to find both King and Spanish Mackerel.

The grouper season has been cut short, so both gag and red grouper cannot be harvested until next year!

Snook are in season and can be caught off the beaches using live pinfish, mullet, or greenbacks freelined in the surf. We also saw many snook around Three Rooker!

As the water cools the fishing will only get better, feel free to call me with any questions. Or start a discussion on our fishing forum.

I would like to schedule a fishing event in the near future. Please reach out to me and let me know what you would like to fish for!




