Fishing Report...

Sheepshead are available around bridges, jetties, and dock pilings. You will need a piece of shrimp, fiddler crabs, or mud crabs for bait. Use a sharp stout #1 or 2 hook with just enough wait to get it to the bottom. These fish have a mouthful of teeth to crush crabs to eat and require a sharp hook to penetrate. They are nick named convict fish due to their black and white bands and because they can steal a bait without notice. When you feel the first tap lift your rod and set the hook. They are great fighters and very good to eat!

Silver trout should be in the channel at the last Dunedin Causeway Bridge. Drift the channel with any 3 inch jig and you can catch enough for a tasty meal. Remember they have a soft mouth so loosen the drag to get them in the boat.

Stone crabs were plentiful before we left for our cruise, we got 4 pounds of claws!

Get out there and catch some fresh seafood!




Book Club...
